

Cable Television Service Interruption Postponed

The scheduled service upgrade that was to result in six TKS cable television channels going off-line has been postponed until Mon. October 9. In most areas, service will be restored on the same day very often within only a few minutes.

The six effected channels have not changed: AXN, BBC Prime, Extreme Sports, NASN, National Geographic and Toon Disney. AFN channels and all other TKS cable television channels will not be effected. TKS is urging subscribers to check with their neighbors to see if they are experiencing the same reception problems before calling in a report. It's Federweissen Season. Try something new!

Try a traditional German specialty at local restaurants on the economy to mark the beginning of the fall season in Europe: young wine and onion cake (Federweisser und Zwiebelkuchen)

What is Federweisser?

It is a milky-turbid, aerated young wine with a light and sweet taste. After the annual grape harvest, the juices from the grapes are separated and allowed to ferment thus producing the milky still-fermenting grape juice known as "Federweisser" (Feder = feather, Weisser = whiter). It is sold starting with 4% alcohol and its alcohol concentration increases during the ongoing fermentation to up to 10%. During the process of fermentation, Federweisser bottles must remain open to avoid explosion, therefore they are difficult to transport and this beverage is therefore usually only available in typical vine growing districts. Not only is it a tasty fall treat, it's also good for you! Federweisser is enriched with yeast particles, lactic acid bacteria and a high concentration of vitamin B1 and B2 and has a positive effect on intestinal activity.



What is Zwiebelkuchen?

It is a classic cake that is traditionally served warm with Federweisser. Guten Appetit.

Take the Fire Prevention Week Quiz

Did you know that more fires start in the kitchen than in any other part of the home? That's why NFPA has chosen "Prevent Cooking Fires" as the theme for Fire Prevention Week (FPW), October 8 - 14. Take this new Fire Prevention Week quiz and see how many questions you can answer correctly. Good luck!

- The leading cause of fires in the kitchen is:*
 - Burnt toast
 - Unattended cooking
 - Oven fires
 - Microwave oven fires
- If you leave the kitchen for even a short period of time while you are frying, grilling, or broiling food, you should:*
 - Turn the stove down low
 - Leave the food cooking as is
 - Turn off the stove
 - Cover the food with aluminum foil

- If you are simmering, baking, roasting or boiling food:*
 - Check it regularly, and stay in the home
 - It is safe to run outside and get your mail
 - Stay in the kitchen and watch the stove
 - It is safe to leave the home for an hour
- When young children are present:*
 - Use the stove's front burners so you can reach them faster
 - Use the stove's back burners
 - Have children sit quietly on the floor so they can't reach the stove
 - Have children stand behind you when you are using the stove
- Keep kids away from cooking areas by enforcing a "kid-free zone" of:*
 - 3 ft. around the stove
 - 1 ft. around the stove
 - 2 ft. around the stove
 - 1 ft. to the right or left of the stove
- If a small grease fire starts in a pan:*
 - Use baking powder to put the fire out
 - Smother flames by carefully sliding the lid over the pan (make sure you are wearing an oven mitt. Turn off the burner.)
 - Pour water on the fire
 - Move the pan to the sink and run water over it.
- When heating food in the microwave.*
 - Use any container that can fit in the microwave.
 - Cover the container with aluminum foil to prevent spills
 - Use only microwave-safe containers or dishes to heat food
 - Avoid wearing clothes with loose sleeves
- If you have a fire in your microwave:*
 - Turn it off immediately and open the door
 - Turn it off immediately and keep the door closed
 - Open the door and attempt to put out the fire
 - Get a lid from a pot or pan and cover the fire
- Spilled food and grease from burners, stove tops and oven should be:*
 - Cleaned up to prevent a fire
 - Kept to a minimum
 - Covered with paper towels to soak up the grease and food
 - Left to harden
- You should treat a burn with cool water for:*
 - 7 to 10 minutes
 - 5 to 7 minutes
 - 3 to 5 minutes
 - Cool water isn't good for a burn
