If you are not accompanying your children, make sure...

- They wear a watch and know when they're curfew is.
- Have enough money to call home if needed.

- Be careful when crossing streets. Walk on sidewalks, not in the street. Walk, do not run, from house to house. Do not cross yards and lawns where unseen objects or the uneven terrain can present tripping hazards.
- Never let your children trick or treat alone! Especially under the age of 12.

- Make sure the material is fire resistant.
- Choose bright colors or add reflective tape.
- Make sure the costume's not a tripping hazard.
- If it's cold outside, wear warm clothes under the costume.
- If they go without you, remind your children...
 1. If approached by a stranger, go to the nearest well lit house and find an adult.
 2. To not trust anyone they don't know or recognize (even if they think they're just fooling around).
- And for all of you who are old enough to do so Don't drink and drive!

Starting in October:

The Bamberg Health clinic would like to welcome two new female providers. The clinic has hired Dr. Yu-Strobel, a general practitioner and Dr. Calhoun, a Family

Medicine practitioner. These new hires give our community a total of four providers.

We Have Added More Appointments: In the past, our providers were on a 30 minute appointment template. Starting in October, all providers are on 20 minute templates, except for wellness appointments (Well Baby/ Well Women). With the new change in appointment times, USAHC Bamberg will add at least 40 new appointments per week.

We Are Now Varying the Times of Advanced Booking: In the past, patients could only book appointments in the afternoons up to two weeks in advance. All morning appointments were same day booking, giving preference to Active Duty sick call. We are now allotting one provider for advanced booking in the mornings with same day booking in the afternoon. These morning appointments will be open for you to book two weeks out.
