NCO's walk the gauntlet during induction ceremony 38th PSB Soldiers keep Army traditions alive in Bamberg

The 38th Personnel Services Battalion held their NCO Induction Ceremony, Aug. 30 at Warner Barracks, Bamberg. 32 newly promoted sergeants were posed with the question, "What is a non-commissioned officer or NCO?" The dic-

tionary defines NCO as a subordinate officer (as a sergeant) in the Army, Air Force, or Marine Corps appointed from among enlisted personnel.

While taking part in the ceremony, Soldiers discovered that the answer is not

that simple. Being an NCO is more than just being of a certain rank, it is about taking responsibility for yourself and others, about leadership and mentoring. The NCO Corps offers support and guidance to all Soldiers, but especially to those newly promoted sergeants, as the overall mission of the Corps is to support those inexperienced NCO's in their roles as leaders.

Any NCO will tell you, that as an NCO, you are the link between receiving the order and completing the mission. An NCO at times is asked to both give and execute orders to get the job done. NCO's are unique in the Army as they come from the enlisted ranks and are promoted to then lead those same ranks, truly, Soldiers leading their peers.

Guest speaker, Command Sgt. Maj. Scottie Thomas, Allied Forces Northern European Command (NATO) Battalion, reminded inductees that the second stanza of the NCO Creed contains the word 'I' seven times. "I will, 'I am', 'I know'. How you will take care of your Soldiers, depends on how you interpret those 'I's," Thomas stated.

Of the five additional studies offered this fall, the book, *Power of the Praying Wife* by Stormie Omarion, will be studied in Spanish. This best-selling author inspires women to develop a deeper relationship with their husbands by praying for them.

Made up of seasoned NCO's, the gauntlet symbolizes the support new sergeants can expect from others in the Corps. The wetting of the stripes is a time honored tradition that was started when rank stripes were sewn on one-by-one. The new stripe would stand out from the old ones and was wetted down to give the appearance that the stripe addition and therefore the promotion, were not recent.

The ceremony was concluded with the new Corps members reciting the NCO Creed and junior Soldiers calling for the new sergeants to lead, teach and mentor them so that they can too, one day be inducted with pride and honor into the Noncommissioned Officers Corps.

Let the puppy buyer beware

Acquiring a new puppy should be a joyous event. However, it is important for buyers to be aware that some unprofessional individuals are out there, selling puppies from Eastern European countries. Regrettably, some of these puppies become sick or even die shortly after their purchase, resulting in large veterinary bills and heart-broken buyers.

Here are a few helpful hints to increase the likelihood of making the right choice when buying a puppy:

- Purchase your puppy from a local source. Make sure you meet with the seller and write down the seller's name, address and phone number. Ask the seller for a list of references to include not only previous buyers but other breeders also.
- Visit the puppy two or three times before making the purchase. This will allow you to not only check out the facility more than once but will also give you a better understanding to the animal's temperament and health.
- Insist on seeing the mother and inspect her. Some less than honest breeders may tell you that the mother was removed because she is either protective of the puppies or that the animals are being weaned. Very good breeders own both mother and father.
- Examine both the puppy's vaccination record and the mother's vaccination record. If the record is in a foreign language, make sure to ask a local vet's office what the vaccinations cover. Also, take notes as to the vaccination dates and the age of the animal when it was vaccinated as this will help the vet's office verify that the animals are on an adequate vaccination schedule.
- Inspect the actual pedigree. Pedigrees should have both the VDH (Verband fuer Hundewesen) and FCI (Federation Cynologique Internationale) symbols and the dogs with these pedigrees MUST be identified by either an individual tattoo or a microchip. These ID numbers must appear in the pedigree as well as the num-

bers from the animal's ancestors.

- Does the breeder have a large selection of animals (and quite possible different breeds) to choose from? This is a huge tip off that they are running a production facility and are breeding for profit.

While most people only initially consider purchasing a purebred puppy, there are an abundance of good animals looking for a new home at your local stray shelter. Many times you can even find purebred animals for adoption at a shelter or breed rescue, although many times these animals do not come with a pedigree. If you are considering adopting from a stray facility, our local shelter publishes a list of animals currently available. This list can be found at www.kmcstrays.com.

Finally, if you do encounter problems when purchasing a puppy, or if you have encountered such problems within the last two years, you are encouraged to contact a Legal Assistance Attorney at your nearest JAG Office, to explore your legal options, such as asserting a warranty claim for reimbursement of expenses. - Military members MUST BE IN UNIFORM. If a military spouse is deployed family members can still tape a greeting. It is recommended that Civilian not wear white, pink or stripe-colored shirts to the tapings.
- Greeting should be no longer than 15 seconds.
- Participants need to state five things within the greeting: who they are, where they are, who the greeting is going to, where they are and a holiday message.
- Do not mention any one specific Holiday in your greeting, so the spot can be aired for a longer period of time.
- The greeting must be to a relative, and you must bring an address (including zip codes) and phone number of the person. The address determines where in the U.S. the greeting will air. If you have friends and family in the same location you can mention your friends. The more information people provide to the hometown news crew the better the chance the greeting will air.
- You will have to fill out a release form.

These really do air, so take advantage of this opportunity to wish your loved ones a safe and happy holiday season.
