## 16th Sustainment processes through DPC, deploys to Iraq

KAISERSLAUTERN, Germany – The 16th Sustainment Brigade completed its final pre-deployment preparations at the Deployment Processing Center and departed from Ramstein Air Base enroute to the Iraqi theater July 19.

The brigade will be conducting sustainment operations there in support of Operation Iraqi Freedom. While at the DPC, the Soldiers from the 16th SB completed their final manifest validation, received their threat briefing from their commander, and measured and weighed their baggage and equipment for the flight.

“It’s going to be a near full flight so if everyone brought their 400 pounds of authorized baggage and equipment, we’re going to be close to being over the authorized cargo limit,” said Cpt. David

### Customer Comments:

I do not feel it is right for wives to go and stay the whole time their husbands have been deployed and still have housing. I feel this is fraud waste and abuse especially the xxx family and the xxx family. These ladies stayed the whole time their husbands were gone and they need to pay for housing or make it a law that everyone can stay in the states while the husbands are in Afghanistan or Iraq. What makes these ladies so special? I thought we were to stay for 60 days and come back? Again this is fraud waste and abuse.

### Response:

First, thank you for submitting an ICE comment card. This is a great way for me to find out what your issues are and it pro-

vides me an opportunity to address your concerns, or clarify situations.

On the issue above we need to differentiate between families who decide to return to the States for a temporary time period and families of DEPLOYED SOLDIERS who decide to temporarily return to the U.S.

In this case the unit was deployed, which means that families are authorized to return to the States without a time limit. "Family members who elect to return to CONUS at personal expense may continue to keep government-controlled family housing, while the soldier is deployed, if the relocation is temporary and the family plans to return to their government-controlled family housing," according to supplement 1 to AR 420-1, Appendix X, X-2.f. This, of course, applies to any family of a deployed Soldier, regardless of unit.

However, there is a requirement for the sponsor, or spouse, to notify the Housing Office at least 5 days prior to the departure if they live in government-controlled family housing and plan to be absent for more

than 30 days. They also need to appoint and identify a point of contact responsible for the quarters during their absence.

Another area that needs to be considered is the Cost-of-Living Allowance, or COLA. The COLA is paid to service members to partially offset high costs when stationed overseas (including Alaska and Hawaii). COLA helps maintain purchasing power so you can purchase about the same goods and services overseas as in the United States. When family members return to the continental United States for a temporary period in excess of 30 consecutive calendar days, the COLA payment beginning on the 31st day that a family member is in the U.S. is reduced to the rate for the number of family members remaining at the permanent duty station. For further information on this subject please contact your local Finance Office.

However, there are limitations if a family decides to temporarily return to the U.S. and the sponsor, i.e. Soldier, is not deployed. In that case the departure is considered per-

manent after 90 days and the quarters will be terminated by the Housing Office.

Obviously sponsors legally separated, divorced or in possession of an approved early return of dependents (EROD) must notify the housing office in writing within 5 days after notification of the change in circumstances and government-controlled family housing will be terminated within 30 days after notification.

I hope this has helped clarify the situation and increased everyone's awareness of what the entitlements are. If you have further questions for concerns please don't hesitate to contact me via email, ICE comment cards, or during my open door policy on Mondays starting at 4 p.m."

# Subject: 101 Critical Days of Summer -- Midpoint

Leaders,

As reminded by the U.S. Army Combat Readiness/Safety Center's most recent "Got Risk?" release, we need to be concerned about the level of accidental risk exposure to our Soldiers over the next several months. A few points for your use:

- We are entering the critical end-of-year period with the added complexity of JTF-E rotations, the 173d Airborne Brigade redeployment, and predeployment training of the 172d Infantry Brigade, in addition to dozens of other unit movements. Please step up your personal engagement as leaders. Ensure that your chain of command, and especially first-line leaders, engage and mentor their Soldiers for mission and off-duty activities. I am absolutely convinced that personal eye-to-eye contact and continuous mentorship works in keeping everyone focused.

- Most of our on-duty fatalities over the past 3 years occurred during mission training and involved planning, execution, or human failures. These include:

-- Two AH-64 aviators at Grafenwoehr crashed during gunnery because of issues relating to crew-coordination and task standards.

-- A Stryker NCO at Grafenwoehr was shot in the head during a live-fire engagement because of failure to adhere to standards. The investigation uncovered the potential for multiple fatalities due to field-of-fire geometry.

-- An ordnance Soldier at Grafenwoehr was crushed between two HEMTTs during ad hoc driver training because of standards and supervision issues.

- We are much better at hazard identification and risk management than we were 10 years ago. The downward trend in fatalities proves that. Hone your subordinates' skills and engage them by asking questions on how they intend to implement and monitor their plans. There may be a tendency to pull packaged assessments off the shelf with minimal conscious reassessment. Ensure that the analysis and the control factors fit the environment, and emphasis is maintained on the application and adjustment of control measures. Follow through.

- A couple of years have passed since our last rail electrocution (an enroute security team OIC climbing atop a Bradley). The continuing requirement for rail operations exposes us to a multitude of serious injury hazards. Remember the wires.

- Off-duty this year, three Soldiers died in separate POV accidents. Two involved speed and loss of control, and both occurred at night. The other was a daytime, head-on crash with a wrong-way driver. But there is good news: Two of the three did not involve alcohol, and none involved motorcycles.

- Near-miss indicators are out there. Just this week, we were lucky that a UH-60 wire strike was limited to damage. Previous wire strikes in the Balkans AOR resulted in fatalities. A few weeks ago a Soldier could have died in a flash fire on a balcony, which was caused by pouring gasoline on a charcoal grill.

- Our history paints clear targets for preventing off-duty summer fatalities. Our Soldiers and Family members die in rivers and quarry lakes, from hits by trains while walking the tracks, from falling down stairs or out of windows, and while driving their cars or motorcycles. Common vehicle-fatality factors are driving too fast in a curve and hitting another vehicle while passing. Excessive alcohol consumption is also a fatality factor, but not considered an "accident."

- There is a common thread for accidents involving behavior: "somebody knew." Two recommendations: First, engage your battlefield intelligence-gathering and assessment skills to detect risk behavior patterns in subordinates and peers. Take action before the situation results in a serious accident. Second, foster the buddy concept. Outside the unit, Family-engagement programs and BOSS-engagement programs exist. Show your support.

USAREUR's FY 08 fatality metric aligns with DA to reduce FY 06 Soldier accidental fatalities by 40%. We track it at this level as a rate with average Soldier population. Last week's POV fatality places us exactly on the 40% mark with a trend in the wrong direction. Looking back to March of last year, we faced a similar situation, but we refocused and were highly successful in preventing summer fatalities. Use this information as the basis to do it again. Stay engaged,

The initial phase of the Romanian's training consisted of classroom instruction where students learned about the fundamentals of driving. In the classroom they also learned about the administrative aspects of driving responsibility, to include learning about maintenance records, tracking ordered parts and licensing drivers.

Students then progressed from classroom lessons on the basics of vehicle operation, to the motor pool where they received hands on instruction on maintenance.

The driving instruction will provide these Soldiers with a base for vehicle operation in their training exercises and the upcoming deployment. For the 541<sup>st</sup> Soldiers this training was a valuable opportunity to interact with their hosts while also working on the practical tasks of training foreign forces.

### 16th at DPC

Hudak, the deputy brigade operations officer. "That's why it's so important to check the baggage here at the DPC before heading over to the ramp at Ramstein."

Hudak said the entire process takes about six hours to complete. The first four hours are at the DPC on Rhine Ordnance Barracks, and the final two hours are on purple ramp at Ramstein Air Base waiting for the call forward.

"Some of the support the Soldiers receive at the DPC includes the use of recreational items like pool and ping pong tables, foosball, board games and televisions with DVD players. The USO also sets up a table to serve snacks and beverages free of charge, and the DPC furnishes ready-made meals for the Soldiers to eat while they are waiting for the call forward," Hudak said.

Hudak noted that this is the first deployment for the brigade as a whole. The 16th SB activated in July 2007 as part of the Army's transformation in Europe. The 16th and the 7th Corps Support Groups combined and transformed into what is now the 16th SB. Oddly enough, the brigade inherited the unit crest of the 16th CSG, but took over the Unit Identification Code of the 7th CSG, Hudak said.

A lot of train up has gone into preparing the brigade for its first deployment. A Mission Readiness Exercise was conducted in February of this year at Fort Knox, Ky., with what used to be the brigade's higher command headquarters – the 3rd Expeditionary Sustainment Command.

Other sustainment brigades belonging to the 3rd ESC also participated in the MRX. In January the 16th SB certified its 391st Combat Service Support Battalion, and in April the brigade certified its 18th Combat Service Support Battalion.

"We've received a lot of new equipment since we stood up last year," Hudak said. "These certifications provided good opportunities to test this equipment and use these new systems."

"I took part in convoy live fire training and Humvee Egress Assistance Training as well as medical training within my section," said Pfc. Ben Malone, a combat medic in Headquarters and Headquarters Company, 16th SB. "A lot of what we trained on wasn't what I expected, but with me being a new Soldier I don't have much to gauge it on."

Malone said it was interesting for him to see all the components of the brigade working together during the train up certifications and exercises they conducted before deploying.

"You get used to working in your own little section but witnessing the bigger picture with everyone working together was much more exciting," said Malone.

The 16th SB will conduct sustainment and support operations while deployed to Iraq in support of Operation Iraqi Freedom. The deployment is expected to last one year.
