ARCOR clients be aware before you share

Customer Comments:

Dear Bamberg,

I am not sure where this belongs, it is not actually a complaint but a concern. I am sending it to the JAG link because it concerns a business off the Kaserne. I saw LTC Rosenburg address concerns in the newspaper about the front gate.

I am currently clearing post, I went to ARCOR, my phone service and they are asking for a copy of my husband's orders. My husband has already left Bamberg and is enroute to Afghanistan and I am clearing the post. ARCOR is not a government agency or office, they serve German and American customers. I am not on a contract of any kind and only pay month to month. German customers do not have to have military orders to cancel a service.

I thought it would be good to address who can and cannot ask for both military orders and military ID cards. If someone could let me know too as I don't believe they need a copy of military orders. They ask for them for the social security number of the soldier. In this case I am going to Virginia where the follow on address is to send the final bill and my husband is at Fort Riley and Afghanistan out of Kuwait.

Please advise and this might be a good one for the community to see on who can and cannot request orders and military ID cards.

Commander's Response:

What is important for you to understand is that there is no general requirement for soldiers (or spouses) to provide German organizations with a copy of their orders. However, if you are asking to be released from an existing contractual obligation based upon the fact that you are leaving Germany (TCSing to OIF/OEF or PCSing) then you may in fact need to provide proof of their deployment/move.

Many ARCOR clients sign a contract valid for either 12 or 24 months. Sometimes the clients deploy or PCS prior to the contractual time being completed. ARCOR is willing to prematurely release them from the contract if there is proof that the client is actually deploying or PCSing. If no orders are provided, ARCOR has the option to hold the customer liable for the time the contract was originally signed for. This means that - even if the phone/internet is not being used - monthly payments will incur until the end of the contract.

This can be a complicated issue and not all phone companies have a policy like ARCOR. Instead, some insist on the contractual time being honored and paid for, regardless whether the client deploys or PCSs. Other contracts may provide for a six month notice before a service or rental agreement may be cancelled, even if the services are paid on a month-to-month basis. Additionally, the agreement may stipulate that the period of time for cancellation may be reduced to 30 days in the event of an order of deployment.

Bottom line: you need to look closely at the contracts/agreements you sign. If you need assistance you can contact the JAG Office at the number below, and they can advise you on your options. Bamberg Law Center, German Attorney, DSN:469-7609.

Wuerzburg's Leighton Barracks now restricted access area only

In order to allow workers to prepare the post for its scheduled closure and return to the host nation later this year, effective Aug. 1, Leighton Barracks in Wuerzburg has become a restricted access only area. Leighton Barracks is no longer accessible simply with a military ID card and is only open for individuals with a verified reason to access the installation.

Access is limited to the Leighton closure team and authorized personnel, whose primary function is the preparation of the installation for its return to the host nation, and the prevention of theft, vandalism or dumping to or on government property.

Please note this change, and stoppage of services on Leighton Barracks, in your travel plans.



1. Share information about source reduction and recycling with family, friends, neighbors, local businesses and decision-makers. Encourage them to learn more about solid waste issues.

2. Reusable containers for food must be carefully cleaned with nontoxic products, e.g. diluted acetic acid, lemon juice or other environmentally friendly detergents, to ensure proper hygiene.

3. Look for batteries with reduced toxic metals.

4. When using single-use items, remember to take only what is needed. For example take only one ketchup packet or napkin if more are not needed.

5. Seldom-used items, like certain power tools and party goods, often collect dust, rust, take up valuable storage space and ultimately end up in the trash. Consider renting or borrowing these items the next time they're needed. Infrequently used items also might be shared among neighbors, friends or family. Borrowing, renting or sharing items saves both money and natural resources. Rent or borrow party decorations and supplies such as tables, chairs, centerpieces, linens dishes, and silverware; seldom-used audiovisual equipment should also be rented or borrowed.

6. Sunshine is not only a source of

warmth, but also, of course, a source of light at the same time. Flicking on the light switches in the daytime may be a habit you can break just by rearranging the furniture.

7. Next time you're ready to repaint, repaper or decorate a room, think about how the room is used before you choose the colors. Light colors in a room will bounce the daylight around, making it a pleasant and cheerful place without extra illumination. This is a much less important factor in bedrooms, which are used primarily at night.

8. In fact, in rooms used solely for sleeping the only advantage provided by windows is ventilation. In the winter solar heat isn't available when the room is in use, so windows should be small or heavily draped to prevent heat from escaping through the glass.

9. Daytime reading and working areas should be located where window light is sufficient on all but the darkest, overcast days. This would include the chair with the magazine rack, the play table for the children, the workbench or the sewing machine. Light also means heat, so you'll be warmer as you work or play in this area.

MK AIRFIELD ADMINISTRATION CENTER, Romania -- A July 30 ceremony marked the end of training at Joint Task Force-East in Romania after a combined, month-long exercise between Romanian and American troops.


"Our Soldiers have lived together, trained together and learned a great deal from each other during this exercise," said Lt. Col. Michael Borg, Task Force Vampire commander.

Task Force Vampire, composed of 426 U.S. Soldiers and 84 Romanian Soldiers, trained from June 10 through July 29.

Training included Military Operations in Urban Terrain (MOUT) site training, weapon familiarization, Humvee training, entry control point training and air assault training.

The U.S. Soldiers who participated in Task Force Vampire were from the Vampire Observer/Controller Team; the 1st Battalion, the 4th Infantry Regiment; New Mexico National Guard's 1st Battalion, 200 Infantry Regiment; and the 541st Engineer Company. The Romanian Soldiers who participated in the exercise came from the 21st Mountain Troops Battalion.

This is JTF-East's first training rotation in Romania after its Proof of Principle exercise last year.



New traffic lights system should save electricity

The city of Bamberg wants to save electricity by using light diodes (LED) in all traffic lights. Already 31 of the 100 traffic lights have the light diodes (LED). The traffic lights will use 70 percent less electricity, which means a savings equaling 168,000 kilowatt hours and a yearly usage of 42 4-person households. Therefore, the city of Bamberg could save 44,000 Euros each year. The life expectancy of LEDs is approximately 10 years. The city of Bamberg will not only save on energy costs but also on maintenance costs.

Bicycle riding is a national sport

The goal of the new Bamberg city building director, who loves to ride his mountain bike, is to expand the city's bicycle paths. Bicycle riding in Bamberg is a popular sport and therefore are a new challenge for the city building- and grounds office. Since 1998 only 3,3 km of additional paths were built. On the contrary, the street network was extended by 6.5 km.

Bamberg's citizens will vote on Wine yard.

The opponents of the wine yard collected 5,200 votes. Now the city council has to react. They want to keep the "Streuobst" or the meadows grassland instead of setting up a wine yard. If the city council does not agree to the wishes of the opponents of the wine yard, then the Bamberg citizens will vote on whether to create a wine yard or to keep the grass land at the St. Michaelsberg. Possible date will be in September 2008.
