BAMBERG – The Bamberg High School Junior Reserve Officers' Training Corps program celebrated its 4th Annual Veterans Day program at the post movie theater Nov. 4.

## Expect repairs, detours soon on JFK Boulevard

Despite starting later than originally intended, construction on JFK Boulevard will begin soon, and when it does Bamberg residents need to be prepared. The project was initially 4 phases however due to high construction bids phases 3 and 4 described in the initial article were dropped from the scope of work.

During Phase I, repairs to JFK Boulevard will be made between 15th and 16th street and continue west toward Gate 1, ending immediately west of the JFK Multiplex. These repairs will be done in seven stages with the beginning and ending dates of stages often overlapping due to the nature of the repairs.

The first stage of Phase 1 will replace the cobblestones on JFK between the Service Credit Union and the west end of the Health Clinic; it will last approximately nine weeks. The cobblestones will be replaced with concrete so the street can withstand heavy military equipment traffic. Sewer lines beneath the cobblestones will also be replaced or repaired as needed.

## Wounded Warriors get recovery assistance at Bamberg's library

Some of the most difficult injuries to overcome are the emotional scars from physical damage. Long after the body has healed, the mind continues to experience the pain and the stress that accompany the injury. Even in cases where the body was damaged during a recreational sport or during a training accident, the mind and emotions must re-adjust to the limitations that arise from the injury.

There are many who have sustained relatively minor injuries to the body, but because their injury prevents them from doing physical things or continuing with their chosen career, they begin to have difficulties in other areas of their life.

These aspects of the injury cannot be overcome with physical therapy. They must be explored through various counseling techniques. Unfortunately some people still balk at the idea of getting counseling and therapy. In order to help these individuals sometimes the key is just giving them the tools to help themselves.

Military Family Life Consultants visited Soldiers from the Bamberg Warrior Transition Unit (WTU) at Bamberg's Community Library to give them a few tools to aid them in their recovery.

"We talk about how creativity and imagination help Soldiers to take care of themselves, and we provide tools to help them do that," said the two Family Life consultants, who requested we not use their names.

These tools include art as therapy as well as a series of questions that help Soldiers explore who they are as a person.

A critical part of their helping these Soldiers overcome the fear of facing their demons is in allowing them to get help in a somewhat anonymous way.

Although the Soldiers may learn the name of the Family Life Consultant during their counseling session, the consultant does not generally share their name with the public and they frequently rotate to other military posts. This enables Soldiers to feel more relaxed because they don't constantly worry about bumping into the person who knows all their "issues" at the grocery store or gas station.

Although this day was dedicated to learning how to cope with emotional issues, the Bamberg Community Library offers Bamberg Wounded Warriors helpful tools every month to help them readjust to their injuries.

During September, the library hosted a Healthy Cook-Off for the WTU Soldiers. The Soldiers and their families were invited to bring a healthy dish for dinner and provide the recipe. At the end of the evening, everyone had shared healthy food, friendship and recipes.


Accomplishing this segment of repair will require a complete detour (see map below). Westbound travel on JFK Boulevard to Gate 1 will detour at 15th Street northward to Artillery Drive where drivers will turn left and progress westward on Artillery Drive to 11th Street (currently blocked by closed gates). At 11th Street, drivers will turn left again and proceed south on 11th Street to JFK Boulevard, which will be open at this intersection for continued westbound traffic.

Health clinic patients will need to follow the detour around the construction and then turn left onto JFK Boulevard and go eastward to the clinic parking lot.

Burger King customers will need to detour through the parking lot behind the car care center and the Service Credit Union via 15th Street. Upon entering the parking lot, drivers will need to turn left and then right following the parking lot route westward to the parking lot behind Burger King. This is also the detour route for Burger King drive-thru service. It is a one-way street through this section so drivers will turn right onto JFK Boulevard upon exiting the drive-thru lane.

Drivers are reminded that during construction, speed should be reduced to accommodate for unusual circumstances.

## Missed appointments hinder health clinic services

Everyday, the Bamberg Health Clinic experiences a high volume of calls with patients needing appointments. From January to September, the health clinic averaged 119 non-cancelled appointments per month, which were logged as No-shows. Although the clinic has seen an increase in the number of available appointments for the months of August, September and October, several appointments continue to be wasted by No-shows.

These missed appointments have a significant impact on our ability to care for those who truly need to be seen by our healthcare providers. Additionally, missed appointments waste valuable resources and interfere with Soldier and unit readiness.

We strive to provide quality healthcare to the Bamberg community, and we need your support to provide that quality care for all of our patients. You can help us achieve these objectives by doing the following:

Please show up 15 minutes early for your appointment. The extra time will allow us to properly screen your medical records and discuss preventive measures and initiatives prior to seeing your care provider. Failure to show up on time for your appointment may be logged as a No-show. The Health Clinic implemented a strict No-show protocol in August. We ask that you please abide to our procedure, and to ensure that you're at your appointment on time.

If you cannot make it to your appointment, please cancel your appointment before 4:30 p.m. the day before your appointment. If you try to cancel your appointment in less than 8 hours prior to your appointment, this may count as a No-show, unless you have a valid reason for the late notification. Sometimes, it is difficult to fill a slot in such short notice.

If for some reasons you are unable to cancel your appointment before the clinic closes, send us an email at [bbghealthcare@amedd.army.mil](mailto:bbghealthcare@amedd.army.mil).

When you call to make an appointment, please update our staff with a correct mailing address and phone number. Updating this information is important. It will help us to keep an accurate demographic record and allow us to send out appointment reminders.

Our health clinic hours are Monday to Friday, 7:30 a.m. to 4:30 p.m. We are closed on U.S. holidays and training holidays. Active Duty sick call is from 7 to 8 a.m.

To make an appointment, please call CIV:0951-300-1750 or DSN:469-1750.

We also recommend calling the 24-hour Nurse Advice Line toll-free at 00800-4759-2330. The Nurse Advice Line can help when you need it. Day or night, if you would like to talk to a nurse about your healthcare questions, a provider is available to give you advice and schedule appointments.

We hope that this information will help us better serve you. Again, if for some reason you are unable to keep your appointment, please call us in advance to reschedule and give someone else a chance to use the care we provide.

school activities. It reflects the character of the corps of cadets."

"When I sang "Wind Beneath My Wings", I was singing it for my dad," Melissa said. "Just the fact that my dad is currently deployed brings about a lot of memories."

Allen Lopez, a veteran who has many memories of his deployments in Vietnam and Korea, said he appreciated the program.

It showed the history well, he said.

To end the program, veterans were asked to come forward and be recognized. Many veterans walked beneath what is commonly known as the Saber Arch on their way to the front of the theater. JROTC cadets pinned flowers on the veterans and thanked them for their service to the nation.

## Disease outbreak reinforces customs rules

MANNHEIM, Germany – The Foot and Mouth Disease outbreak in England last year demonstrates again the devastation foreign pests and diseases could wreak in the United States should they get past our defenses. For this reason, U.S. personnel stationed in Europe must observe strict customs rules that apply for carrying or sending food or plants to America.

For those who choose to ignore these laws, the Bureau of Customs and Border Protection issues fines of \$300 or more.

Officials say most military mail violations originate in Germany and Spain and mainly involve sausage and salami.

"Many food items are prohibited from going back to the States," said Bill Johnson, director of the USEUCOM Customs Executive Agency. "Red meats, sausages, pâtés and salami can harbor germs or disease viruses — even if canned — and are therefore barred from import," he explained. Even pasta or soup mixes that contain dried meat are not allowed.

Fresh fruits and vegetables are forbidden to be carried or sent into the U.S. because they can contain the eggs of voracious

pests. Soil can also harbor the eggs of pests; therefore, everything mailed or shipped to the U.S. must be cleaned thoroughly. It is also forbidden to transport foreign plants into the U.S.

Certain processed vegetable or fruit products including canned fruit, olive oil or mustard can be mailed stateside. Cured cheeses, bread, candies and cookies are also acceptable, Johnson added.


